Featured Performer Lou Jacklich



LOU JACKLICH has been a professional accordionist for 75+ years. Since the age of 17, Lou Jacklich has taught for the Meni-Ketti studio and toured vaudeville. In the 50s he founded the "Lou Jacklich School of Music" with 450+ students and 9 teachers. In the late 50's, Lou was a pioneer on the electronic accordion and was in high demand with his virtuoso artistic arrangements.

At 95 years of age, Lou currently teaches both in person and via Zoom and is an active member of several local accordion clubs. He performs his own jazz arrangements to the delight of audiences. Lou has received local and international acclaim including Cotati Accordion Festival Honorary Director in 2016.

Later this month, The San Francisco Accordion Club will be presenting a student Scholarship to Cotati in Mr. Lou Jacklich's honor! (See flyer on pg5) Hello Accordion Friends -

It was quite a party on Sunday. July 9, for our Fourth of July themed meeting. I arrived at 1:30 to find the room set up with round tables and a central long buffet table loaded with delicious lunch items, provided by Silicon Valley Accordion Society Board.

During the course of the meeting, we enjoyed the performances of eight individual players and a volunteer jam band. We didn't take a formal break, but seven attendees took home raffle prizes, and we enjoyed the music until 4:20 pm. The write-ups for each performer will necessarily be quite brief this month!



Reno DiBono entertained us while we all filled our plates and sat down to enjoy his renditions of six Italian songs, followed by an Argentine tango. Reno sang along to a few of the songs, and we always enjoy his performances.

Next, we heard from Rudy Pivk, who started by playing two Italian songs, and followed them with a lovely waltz and a fun version of "Hernando's Hideaway." Rudy showed us lovely technique and interesting rhythms during his performance.

The volunteer Jam Band was next. We had received copies of the music in advance, so presumably that helped the 14 participants (13 accordions and a violin) play more competently. The songs performed included a number of patriotic tunes and the audience of about 20 people was quite appreciative. As one of the participants, I can say that I enjoyed playing with this group.













Our next entertainer was Ed Massolo. His selections included a waltz medley of "Fascination," "Around the World in 80 Days," and "Melody of Love." He followed these with a polka and another lively number, all very enjoyable.

Bill Likens performed four energetic songs, standing to perform and singing along during much of the performance. His rendition of "Old Time Rock and Roll" was enthusiastic and fun.





Bob Stanfield played a medley of military theme songs (Army, Navy, Marines, Air Force and Coast Guard). He followed the medley by playing and singing a song about a blind soldier, "Doesn't Anybody Know My Name."

Don Savant is a frequent performer at our meetings, and today he played three numbers, demonstrating a nice style throughout his performance of "Girl from Ipanema," "Misty," and "Scotch and Soda."





Paul Aebersold demonstrated his very nice style as he played three numbers for us, starting with "I Left My Heart in San Francisco." He followed this with two French songs, one of which had "Mack the Knife" as the beginning and ending sections!

Mike Zampecini completed the program for the day. He performed on his 72bass, 17-pound accordion, and made it sound like a concert instrument! He started by playing "Stars and Stripes Forever" with fingers flying so fast over the keys that you couldn't actually see them. He followed this with a couple of other prepared songs and then took requests, playing eleven numbers all together. He has masterful technique and knows how to improvise and embellish the songs he is playing. He also has a strong singing voice, which accompanied many songs. A very enjoyable conclusion to our afternoon.
