MURL ALLEN SANDERS is a musician, composer, teacher and recording artist who is active in the Seattle area music scene and across the United States, Canada, England, Brazil and Japan. Murl has worked with such diverse artists as as Chuck Berry, Etta James, Il Divo, Glenn Yarbrough, Seattle Symphony, Brazilian accordion virtuoso Chico Chagas, virtuosos Stas Venglevski and Gary Blair, Leroy Bell, Peter Duchin, Alarm Will Sound, Seattle Modern Orchestra, Cascade Symphony, Everett Philharmonic, Orchestra Seattle/Seattle Chamber Singers, The Von Trapp Children, Theodore Bikel, Leslie Gore, Barbara Lamb, Susan Pascal, Warren Rand, Pearl Django, Michael Tomlinson and Kelly Harland, among many others.

Murl teaches piano and accordion privately and is also adjunct faculty at Cornish College of the Arts and Shoreline Community College in Seattle. He has received two grants from The Seattle Mayor's Office of Arts and Cultural Affairs to compose She Blows Hot and Cold for chorus and symphony orchestra which premiered May 2, 2010, and a grant to compose his Accordion Concerto No. 2 which premiered in 2007 with Orchestra

Seattle/Seattle Chamber Singers. His Accordion Concerto No. 1, a commission from Orchestra Seattle/Seattle Chamber Singers, premiered in 2003. Murl received a 2010 and 2009 ASCAP plus award for his concert compositions from The American Society of Composers, Authors and Publishers.

Nowhere mentioned above: Murl also occasionally accompanies himself with vocals.

Driving directions to Christ Episcopal Church, 1040 Border Road, Los Altos, CA 94024

From Hwy 280, San Jose area: North on Hwy 280, exit at El Monte Road, East (toward the Bay, away from the hills) at the 3rd signal, turn right on University Ave, (if you get to the Foothill Expressway, you have gone one block too far) approx. ¼ mile to end of University, turn right, go about 100 feet, turn left on Border Road. In one block you will see the Christ Episcopal Church sign, turn right into the driveway and go up the hill for parking.

From Hwy 280, San Mateo and other northern locations, take 280 south to El Monte Road and go east away from the hills and toward the bay. At the 3rd signal, turn right on University Ave, drive approx.. ½ mile to end, turn right, go 100 feet, turn left onto Border Road. In one block, you will see the Christ Episcopal Church sign, turn right into the driveway and go up the hill for parking.

They started their program with Norma singing, Going Along With The Breeze and Don filling in with a light accompaniment. We loved their rendition of *Moonglow*. The smile comes so easily for Norma. She is a professional. It is amazing how she keeps that beautiful alto voice so sharp. Don has a very pleasing jazz style that is so easy to listen to. He has mastered the digital Roland and makes his changes easily. Norma played her new Ottovianelli. These two accordions make a mellow sound, just like they belong together. We enjoyed I Can't Give You Anything But Love Baby and Taking A Chance On Love. Norma and Norma singing and Don accompanying Don really compliment each other. They finished their program with



When You're Smiling. Norma put her "all" into the last measures. The whole piece sounded super. Sing it to yourself and you will see it requires a crescendo at the finale.

We owe a lot to these two. SVAS was formed in March of 2003. Don Pandori was the first president and Norma Parsons was vice president. Norma was responsible for getting a contract with Harry's Hofbrau which lasted 16 years. In the early years they sometimes had a full house of 120! Mei Liu treated us to a variety of tunes, beginning with a classical arrangement of Twinkle Twinkle Little Star. Mei did an excellent job. She followed this with Beer Barrel Polka, a must for the accordion. And she concluded with *The Merry Widow* with that fine waltz tempo and a very smooth ending. Thanks Mei!

Next, it was the turn of the Happy Days Band. Ken Caple introduced the band members, and honorary member Roy Helsing (who played his digital Concerto accordion, making 3 electronic accordions playing at this meeting: Roy, Ken Caple and Don Pandori!) Roy flew

down from Mendocino. And Lou Buonomo flew in from Dallas, Texas. The band played their Oktoberfest selection. All the tunes were well-known favorites: 6 (count 'em!) polkas—Barbara, Beer Barrrel, Just Because, Liechtensteiner, Pennsylvania and TickTock. There were even more famous waltzes—Ach Du Lieber Augustine, Blue Danube, a particularly beautiful version of Blue Skirt, and a medley of Du Du Leigst Mir im Herzen and You are the Only One, Edelweiss, and Schneewalzer. The last one has been played by the André Rieu orchestra, but the Happy D ays Band almost put them to shame! The hardcore Oktoberfest selection included In Heaven there is No Beer, In Munchen There Is a Hofbrau, Deep In Bohemia, And the selections were peppered with golden oldies like Wooden Heart (actually a German folk song, but made famous internationally by Elvis Presley). It was a glorious performance, and clearly much appreciated. Afterwards, Hubert Kallabis and Bill Tapogna played their two latest favorites, Rancherfest and In Den Bergen, such lively tunes. We really enjoyed it!



Just before the break, Bill announced a recognition of Misha Studenkov. Misha is a high school student, and like many of his cohorts very interested in music. However, Misha is also an accomplished accordion (and piano!) player. Bill pointed out that Misha is the future of the accordion in this area, and that it is great to see a young person at meetings. When time permits, Misha now practices and plays with the Sunday Seven band.

The Peter Di Bono Trio has played many times for SVAS. We always look forward to their return and we are never disappointed. They entertained us for over an hour and we would have loved another hour. They began with *La Vie En Rose*, followed by *Ashokan Farewell*, both of which are among Harriett's favorites. This group plays with such great feeling. Peter mentioned that the feeling is created by the left arm. He stressed how important it is to listen to what you are playing. They played some requests, *All I Ask of You, You Belong To My Heart*, the theme from the Shogun series, *La Paloma*, *The Anniversary Waltz*, *Time After Time*, and *The Tennessee Waltz*. The Di Bono Trio got our dancers on their feet for the tangos and waltzes. They rounded out their program with a medley from the Musical "Sound of Music," *Edelweiss, Do-Re-Mi, Climb Every Mountain, The Hills Are Alive*, and *My Favorite Things*. The violin and bass are perfect with the accordion as the expression can be so intense. Yes! We wanted more!

This Trio have played together for over 30 years, but also do separate gigs. Peter and Harriett played the Crown Room at the Fairmont Hotel in San Francisco for 6 years. Peter Di Bono has put in many 12 hour days performing, and enjoys passing his knowledge on to his students. Harriett Newhart has her own business, Starlite Strings. She provides music tailored especially for each bride and groom, 22 piece ensembles for dignitaries, and 13 strolling violins for corporate parties. Steve Hanson adds so much to the trio. Steve supports many groups, and drives over 60,000 miles going to the 300 or so music dates. As a young man, Steve got his start in music when he served in the Navy.
