Norma Zonay Parsons February 10, 1927- August 23, 2021

When you picture Norma, first to mind is that winning smile. She greeted everyone with a cheerful countenance. That smile fit into every facet of her life. Norma was well educated beyond her school years. She was an avid reader, interested in a variety of subjects, a good listener with high retention, and willing to embrace new technology and thought.

At age 19, she and her Accordion joined two other girls, one playing bass and one playing guitar. They hired an agent and went on the road. In the late 40's this was unheard of for females. Norma was the youngest but fell into the role of managing and dealing with the agent. Besides their regular performances they did live radio, entertained at veteran hospitals, and homes for the elderly. Norma continued playing at community living centers until just a few years ago.

Norma had an interest in accordion and started lessons at the age of 10. Music stayed an integral part of her entire life. She played accordion and organ and was blessed with a fine alto voice. You can see that a winning smile combined with singing and playing was an asset for her. Norma had an uncanny memory for lyrics. After three notes she could finish almost any song. If she wanted an accent, it was a snap for her to pick up.

Norma also worked as a secretary for her husband, Bob for some years and later for another electronic company after he retired. At this time, she took an evening class from John Powers and did some highend modeling. That smile must have come in handy!

In 2003 Silicon Valley Accordion Society was founded. Norma served as the first vice president and program director. She made it possible for SVAS to make Harry's Hofbrau its permanent home. Norma was fond of duets. She played several years with violinist, Tyanne Boye. After "Bellows & Bows," Norma played with "Absolute Accord." They had lots of gigs and many hours together in practice. They had a terrific sound, and they formed everlasting friendships. Through the years our lady played various duets on stage and off. Hope you were one of the lucky ones!

Norma taught many to play. If you were lucky enough to be her student, you soon became one of her many friends.

Through the years, although Norma left home at 19, she wrote faithfully to her parents, and they visited her on the road. Her Dad's favorite memory was visiting Jackson WY, catching cutthroat trout with the girls, and watching them perform at night. Norma will be laid to rest in Inglewood, CA next to her parents.

We will always remember Norma and that beautiful smile.
